Flight of 'Strangler' Provides A.5 Rip-Roaring Story While It Lasts

By Nicholas von Hoffman Washington Post Staff Writer

LYNN, Mass., Feb. 25-It was a good, old-fashioned, sensational story. No CIA, no international implications, no threat to democratic institutions or individual liberty, just a riproaring police story with all the homey, oldtime ingredients - murder, sex, sadism, loud-mouthed lawyers and hysteria.

For 30 hours while he'd been free, it had been a pip of a story, then the suspense ended when the self-proclaimed Boston Strangler had walked into a haberdashery here and given

himself up.

This was the right place to end the story, in a late 19th century town of crooked streets and loft factories, the right place for the "Strangler," who had confessed to 13 fiendish 19th century murders. And the way the town reacted to the news that Albert DeSalvo was in police headquarters made you think of the wax museum with those tableaus of dusty mannequins reenacting bloody, entertain-

ing crimes. Hundreds of hooded, scarfed people stood outside the police station and let the ice on Johnson Street go through the soles of their shoes and constrict their capillaries while they waited to see the "Strangler."

"I saw him! Wasn't he aw-w-ful? Take my picture! Do you think we'll be on the 6 o'clock news?" they shouted in frigid and de-lighted satisfaction, when they saw the man who looked like an unemployed dishwasher.

In captivity, he was an anti-climax, a nothing in his stolen pea jacket and bell bottom trousers. He looked like the floors on the courthouses and police stations they kept taking him to, muddled, salt-stained, littered, walked on by large male feet in galoshes and service shoes.

He was better in the hours before his capture. Then he'd been a good story. "Stark Fear Grips Three States - Women Beware! He's A Cutie—Keep Chain Lock Bolted," the Boston Record-American had warned while offering a \$5000 reward for the "Strangler" alive or dead.

In the hours before they got him, Boston had suddenly seemed peopled with retired school teachers, aging nurses, Victorian females of the dancing years and

vulnerability.

"I'm alone with my cousin and she's a shut-in, but our janitor's a good man and he won't let strangers in, at least I pray to God he won't," confided a woman on the subway train and it in an old-fashioned way.

Boston Strangler' Gives Up in

Store

DeSalvo Hunt Ends Quietly In Lynn, Mass.

From News Dispatches

LYNN Mass., Feb. 25 Albert DeSalvo, the selfconfessed Boston strangler, surrendered meekly today to two uniform store employes after one of the largest manhunts in New Englan history.

DeSalvo said he had escaped from Bridgewater State Hospital yesterday to call public attention to his need for rehabilitation.

"Maybe people will know what it means to be mentally ill," he said as he was taken in manacles into the Lynn police station.

Reported Despondent

DeSalvo reportedly had been despondent because he was not receiving what he considered adequate treatment at the mental hospital.

Police said DeSalvo told them he had broken into a home at 785 Western Ave. in Lynn Friday and spent the night in the basement, stealing the Navy clothing he was wearing when captured.

At that address, police found clothing and other than strewn by the basement and other evidence of Desalvo's presence.

The owner, Arthur Vincent, commented: "Oh, my, we had no idea he was here ..."

no idea he was here ..."

Vincent, who lives in the house with his sister, Mrs. Simone Fedas, said he heard "a bump or something" at about 2:30 a.m., but fell asleep again immediately. Mrs. Fedas said she "felt faint" when police told her what the bump might have been.

Moved to Prison

Shortly after his arrest De-Salvo was transferred to Walpole State Prison despite one attorney's expressed fears that he might try to kill himself or become the target of hard-core criminals.

DeSalvo, who has confessed murdering 13 Boston area women, escaped with two companions before dawn yesterday. They were captured in Waltham, a Boston suburb, last night as the hunt for DeSalvo spread from Canada

to Florida.

A state official said one of DeSalvo's two brothers—who had been arrested and charged with helping him escape—first tipped police that DeSalvo was in the Lynn area.

But it appeared that De-Salvo may have intended to surrender anyway.

He entered the Simons Uniform Store about 2 p.m. wearing part of a sailor suit and a rumpled Navy pea jacket that he had changed into sometime after his escape.

Alan Simons, 30, a partner in the uniform firm, said De-Salvo walked up to a salesman, and said, "Can I use the phone? I want to call F. Lee." F. Lee Bailey is his lawyer.

Bailey was not in his office but DeSalvo talked to the lawyer's private detective, Attorney Andrew Tuney, a former state police lieutenant who once headed the Boston strangler investigation.

Simons and the salesman. Jimmy Trellegan, 32, recognized DeSalvo and while he was on the phone, called Lynn police.

"When he got off the phone he said he was hungry," Simons said. "We told him to come on out back and we'll make some coffee. We made the coffee and waited for the police."

Trellegan sald he frisked DeSalvo and found no weapon on nim.

Simons said neither nor the salesman was arraid of the Boston strangler. "Nobody was scared. He wasn't a very big person. He never went after men anyway," said Simons.

While the five were having coffee, Simons said DeSalvo mentioned "he knew we knew who he was.

"He told us to call off the police because he wanted to turn himself in," he said.

Simons described DeSalvo as looking "tired, tired around the eyes, like someone who had been out all night and hadn't slept.

"He was pretty calm and quiet. So we just let him stay that way until the police came."

Tuney, the detective De-Salvo called, said the fugitive told him he was in Lynn and added: "Do me a favor and call off the police and I'll stay here till you come."

"I promised him I would."

Tuney said. "Before we could get there, the police had him. How, I don't know."

One of the arresting officers, Robert Clounan, said they found DeSalvo in the back room of the store "leaning against a water cooler. He said he wanted to give himself up and to contact state police.

"We put handcuffs on him right away. He wasn't armed and he was very docile. He didn't give us any trouble."

An unruly mob of 2000 jammed into the narrow street outside police headquarters as word of DeSalvo's arrest spread through the area.

"Kill him," were the shouts of some in the crowd. The gathering broke up only after DeSalvo was taken from the station to court.

Detectives formed a tight ring around the prisoner and pushed through the crowd to put him in a police car for the trip to Cambridge. DeSalvo was handcuffed. He smiled and winked at several newsmen whom he recognized from a recent trial.

In New York, Attorney Bailey said DeSalvo had left a note by his hospital bed saying he was escaping to "force public officials to admit" he is the Boston "strangler." He said the note also tried to establish that he had stayed in the hospital willingly for 2½

years becau g ie wanted to get psychiatric help.

Bailey also said DeSalvo had walked past four state troopers in a parking lot in Lynn without being spotted — even though he was wearing brown shoes and no kerchief with the Navy uniform.

Bailey said he would seek a writ of habeas corpus to free DeSalvo from Walpole prison under the Eighth Amendment, which deals with cruel and unusual punishment.

As for the \$10,000 reward he had offered for DeSalvo's capture alive, Bailey said it "looks like a surrender"—indicating he would not pay the reward.

The first real break in the dramatic manhunt came Friday night when the two men who escaped with DeSalvo were captured in a Waltham bar 13 hours after the break. Fred A. Erickson, 40, of Brockton, serving a life sentence after he stabbed his estranged wife 27 times in 1954, and George W. Harrison, 33, of Westford, serving an 11-to-15-year term for armed robbery, were returned to the mental hospital.

The trail grew still hotter when DeSalvo's brothers were arrested on charges of helping him escape.

Richard E. DeSalvo, 31, asked for a hearing and was released in \$500 bail. Joseph DeSalvo, 37, pleaded innocent and was released in \$1000 bail.

Massachusetts Attorney General Elliot L. Richardson said that after the breakout the three escapees stole a car and drove to Boston's Haymarket Square. DeSalvo dropped them there and drove to suburban Everett where he rendezvoused with his brother Joseph at a gas station, Richardson said. Joseph then dropped him off at Lynn, the attorney general said.

Near the Everett gas station police today found the stolen car, a pillowcase from the hostipital, 30 candy bars and Albert DeSalvo's glasses.

Richardson said DeSalvo had about \$150 on him when captured.

DeSalvo's escape took place only five weeks after he was convicted and sentenced to life on a series of sexual attacks and robberies involving four Greater Boston women in 1964. The charges were unrelated to the stranglings.

He was being held in Bridgewater pending an appeal to the Massechusetts Supreme Court by Bailey.

The Real Issue at the Trial: Defendant DeSalvo's Mind

The mind of Albert DeSalvo, the self-confessed Boston Strangler, and not his guilt, was the real issue when he was on trial last month. His crimes—armed robbery, breaking and entering, assault, unnatural acts—were admitted. And also admitted were the crimes he had not been charged with—the murders, rapes and revolting perversions committed by the Strangler.

From two psychiatrists called by defense attorney F. Lee Bailey, DeSalvo's jurors in the Middlesex Superior Court at Cambridge, Mass., had heard a chilling descrip-

tion of DeSalvo's mental condition.

He was mentally diseased, paranoid and schizophrenic. certain peak they became un-He was driven by over-controllable or irresistible and he whelming and abnormal sex- | had to do what he did." ual urges which he could not curb. He was homicidal.

"He has created, by means of a schizophrenic process, a world of his own where he simply rules supreme and therefore what he feels and does he must do, and it has to be right because he is the sole judge," Dr. James A. Brussel told the jurors.

The psychiatrist, assistant com-missioner of the New York State Department of Mental Hygiene, testifying as a witness for the defense, agrees with Bailey that DeSalvo should be sent to a first-rate research institution where the 35-year-old defendant could be studied.

His Own Rules In His Own World

He told the jurors that DeSalvo "knows what is regarded by so-ciety as right and wrong" but, in his self-created world, "it means nothing."

The other defense psychiatrist, Dr. Robert Ross Mezer of Boston, also diagnosing DeSalvo as schizo-phrenic, told the jurors that even though the former Army ser-geant might know he was committing a crime, an unlawful act, he did not have the "capacity to conform his conduct to the requirements of the law."

He said DeSalvo suffered from abnormal sexual "impulses or urges going back a long way, that they would vary in inten-sity, that when they reached a Now the jurors were to hear

what the prosecutor, Assistant District Attorney Donald L. Conn, believed was DeSalvo's mental condition, from the testimony of other psychiatrists and from a former inmate at Bridgewater State Hospital, where DeSalvo first confessed he had murdered and raped 13 women in the Greater Boston area between 1962 and 1964.

Prosecutor's Ex-Con Surprises Defense

Conn, a classmate of Bailey's at Boston University Law School, told the jurors he was going to prove that DeSalvo was not mentally diseased to the point where

he should escape punishment. He asked the jurors to send DeSalve to prison for life, as a shrewd-law-breaker who got into apartments to steal, and who was neither a sex manac nor a sick man but a "cunning, clever, manipulative criminal."

Before calling the psychiatrists, Conn surprised the defense by putting an ex-convict, Stanley Setterlund, on the stand. (Later, Conn, who now is an assistant attorney general for the commonwealth, said that he believed Setterlund's testimony was one of the main reasons the jurors refused to accept the defense's insanity pica).

Setterlynd, a thin, leconic welder, said he met DeSalvo in Bridgewater in January, 1965, and Albert told him "he had something bigger than the Brink's robbery and the Plymouth mail robbery.

Q. Did he tell you specifically what he was referring to? A.

About some murders.

Q. How many murders. A. Eleven. Q. What did he say about the 11 murders? A. He said they were worth a lot of money . . . \$10,worth a lot of money . . . \$10,-000 apiece. He said he knew about the murders and he was

the man they were looking for.
Q. Did he tell you anything
about the places of the murders,
the apartments? A. Yes...he told me that he went there to commit robbery and rape.

Describes Actions Inside Apartments

Q. Did he tell you what he did before he went into the apartments? A. He would case the place . . . look the place over and see if there were other ways of getting out of there.

Q. Did he tell you what he did there he get into the apartment?

after he got into the apartment? A. Yes, he would check and see who else was in the apartment besides the lady . . . then he would make advances towards her. Rape

her.
Q. What did he tell you about the victims? A. Well, if they put up a lot of noise, he strangled them to shut their big mouth.
Then Setterlund told Conn that Albert deliberately would not take

all the jewelry and cash in the apartments . . "If it was three or four rings he would take some, maybe two or three, and leave one. Money, he would not take all the money, he would leave some

"Like maybe \$90, he would maybe take about everything but \$16, leave \$16 or something like that," Setterlund said.

Q. What was his reason for do-

ing this? A. So it would look like a sex maniac had been there . . . not a robbery

Q. What did he do after he got the money and killed the victims? A. Well, he would clean up after, he would wipe everything off . . . so it wouldn't look like a robbery.

Conn asked the welder if Albert had discussed his future plans, and Setterland said Albert had told him he "wanted a good law-yer and to go to a good hospital and have a head operation and get free . . . he was too young, he was only 33 years old, he didn't want to spend the rest of his life in there."

Setterlund swore Albert also boasted that one magazine had offered him \$40,000 and another \$90,000 for his story, "plus the reward money was around \$108,-000." And there was talk about a movie "worth a million dollars."

Quizzed by Bailey On DeSalvo's Approach

With this, Conn turned his witness over to Bailey, and within a few minutes the jurors learned that Setterlund had been a client of Bailey's. Setterlund admitted he had been introduced to Bailey at Bridgewater by another in-mate, but denied it was Albert.

(Bailey represented Setterlund on an escape charge. The former convict escaped from Worcester County Jail, where he was serving time for unarmed robbery.)

Setterlund insisted - that De-Salvo has spoken to him about the strenglings the first time they met in Bridgewater. Bailey asked: "I take it, Albert walked up, in-troduced himself and said, 'I am the Strangler and that is worth a lot of money?' Is that the way it happened?"

"Pretty close," Setterlund

answered.

Q. He walked up to you and said, Hi, I am Al and I am the Strangler and that is worth a

lot of money? A. No, that isn't the way. Q. Tell us how. A. I was sitting there with another inmate there at a table and he came over and talked with us.

Bailey asked if Albert hadn't said he wanted a head operation "to correct whatever was causing him to do these things, these stranglings?" The witness ans-wered, "no, Albert just wanted to get out."

"Did you ask him, Stanley?" Bailey asked, and Setterlund answered, "No, I never did ask him that."

After this witness, Conn called several other witnesses to testify that there was nothing unusual about Albert's behavior on the job—he worked for a construction company—or among his acquaint-ances, or when he did odd jobs for neighbors.

(The defense psychiatrists had already pointed out that when Albert was in a "controlled" environment, such as an institution, or the Army, he was well-be-haved. On the loose, they said, Albert was a different man.)

As Conn's first expert witness, he called Dr. Ames Robey, who had been medical director of Bridgewater when Albert confessed he was the Strangler, and who resigned last year. It became

Albert obvious that he and hadn't gotten along.

Albert, said Robey, was suffering not from a mental disease, but from a personality disorder, common to most criminals. He was an "anti-social sociopath" of the "sexual deviant type." And at Bridgewater, he said Albert was "the rabble-rousing type."

Albert, said the former director, had "very little concern for rules and regulations. There were con-stant complaints about the behavior allegedly being directed at him" in Bridgewater.

Robey admitted that DeSalvo did not give him a medical his-tory and that he had at one time diagnosed the defendant as schizophrenic, but had changed his

Conn asked the big question, the one which in Massachusetts determines whether a defendant is legally sane or insane: on the dates of DeSalvo's attacks against the four women victims who had testified, could Albert distinguish between right and wrong and was he laboring under an irresistible

impulse?
"My opinion," said Robey, "is that he could clearly distinguish between right and wrong . . . My opinion is that he was not labor-ing under an irresistible impulse."

With this, Robey was turned over to Bailey for cross-examina-

Robey said he thought DeSalvo was not so mentally diseased that he could not conform his conduct to the requirements of the law.

Calls Insanity Plea Lawyer's Idea

Q. Doctor, when we sat in your office in about June of 1965, did you not say to me that under the irresistible impulse test Albert would be responsible, but under the Model Penal Code Test, you felt that he would not? A. Yes, I said that.

But Robey said he had changed his mind. He had decided later that Albert had tricked him by faking hallucinations.

He had decided, Robey insisted, that Albert had been given the idea by Bailey that if he pleaded insanity, "he would be found not guilty and sent to an institution such as Johns Hopkins or Presbyterian."

"I think the phrasing was 'anything better than Bridge-water,' was it not?" Bailey asked. Robey admitted that DeSalvo had made complaints about Bridgewater before Bailey became his attorney.

Q. How many qualified psychiatrists did you have at the time you were there and Albert was there? A. Just exactly one.

Q. How many patients? A. I believe at that time we were running 690.

Robey said he was familiar with DeSalvo's family history
... "the patient's father was a building superintendent and maintentance man alleged to have been extremely brutal, indulging in incest with his daughters, promiscuous with women, apparently very large numbers of them, and neglecting his famity duties . . . the patient his famiy duties . . . the patient apparently witnessed a great many of these sexual preversions and practices."

The witness insisted he had changed his mind about DeSalvo's insanity after listening to Dr. Mezer's testimony earlier in the trial.

Can't Recall What Altered His Opinion

Q. What did Dr. Mezer say that surprised you or caused you to change your opinion? Just what he said? A. Gee, Mr. Bailey, I really don't think I could quote it verbatim.

Q. Well, gee, Dr. Robey, I wish you'd tell us in substance what he said. A. I really can't, Mr. Bailey...I have something awfully close, you know I discussed it with the members of the staff at Bridgewater. Maybe if I.

Here Judge Cornelius J. Moynihan interrupted with: "No. No. doctor. If you don't remember,

Robey: I just don't remember." Mr. Bailey.

The psychiatrist also said he had changed his opinion after hearing Setterlund's testimony about DeSalvo.

With this, Bailey showed Robey his own notation on Setterlund, from the Bridgewater records.
Robey had found Setterlund

"guilty of a considerable degree of lying on an enormous amount

of issues."
Q. When did you decide Stanley Setterlund was a man of truth? A. When we discharged him,

Q. When did he stop lying? A. Again, I would have to make reference to the record . . . he appeared to me to be truthful. I am relying on my observation of his appearance on the stand lest Friday.

Bailey: I see. That is all. Two more psychiatrists were waiting to be called by Conn. One of them was the acting director of Bridgewater, who was there when Albert escaped last





Attorney Says DeSalvo Fears

Boston, Feb. 26 (Special)—Albert DeSalvo, who says he is the Boston Strangler, is afraid his fellow inmates at Walpole State Prison may kill him, and is so depressed after being committed to the prison for life that he might commit suicide, one of his attorneys said today.

DeSalvo, 35, is under constant guard in a hospital cell after his escape from a state hospital set off a nationwide mailhunt and frightened women on the East Coast who live alone, as the Strangler's 13 victims did.

F. Lee Bailey, DeSalvo's attorney, plans to seek a writ of habeas corpus, which would move DeSalvo back to Bridgewater State Hospital, his home behind bars for $2\frac{1}{2}$ years before he escaped Friday. He surrendered quietly to police in a Lynn clothing store yesterday.

Bailey said DeSalvo left note by his Bridgewater hospital bed saying he was escaping to "force public officials to admit" he is the Boston Strangler.

Says DeSalvo Wanted Help

Bailey said police warnings and the vast manhunt prove that he is the strangler, saying police "gave a warning consistent only with a killer of the strangler's notoriety.

The note also disclosed, according to Bailey, that DeSalvo tried to establish that he stayed at Bridgewater for 2½ years because he wanted to get help for his illness.

Charles Burnim, a Bailey associate, said DeSalvo told him "threats" have been communicated to him—that "they're waiting for the Boston Strangler to come to Walpole."

Committed to Walpole

Aftert is fil," Burnim said, "we don't think he belongs there. He

don't think he belongs there. He should be confined in a hospital, and the only state hospital is Bridgewater."

DeSalvo was committed to Walpole for life yesterday by Judge Corneilus J. Moynihan in Middlesex County Superior

Moynihan revoked his order of Jan. 18, which suspended carry-ing out the sentence, and ordered DeSalvo to Bridgewater pending an appeal to the State Supreme

DeSalvo was sentenced last month after an all-plate jury in

Cambridge convicted him on charges of sexual assault on four

women in their homes and of robbery. None of the charges was related to the stranglings.

Under Constant Guard

A spokesman for the State Correction Commission said De-Salvo was being held under constant guard in the hospital cell at Walpole pending a decision, probably tomororw, on where he would be moved within the maximum security prison.

Gov. John A. Volpe ordered an investigation into the escape of DeSalvo and two other inmates from the state hospital at Bridge-water.

Corrections Commissioner John A. Gavin, other corrections officials and the Bridgewater superintendent, Charles Gaughan, met at Bridgewater "to discuss security and other problems."

DeSalvo's escape brought back for many the fear that gripped the Boston area when 13 women were strangled in their homes between June, 1962, and January, 1964.



Bailey Plays Perry Mason In Case of 'Boston Strangler'

BOSTON, Mass., Feb. 26 Andrew Tuney Jr. plays Paul Drake to F. Lee Bailey's Perry Mason, and today the private detective was drinking Scotch on the rocks, swiveling in the boss's chair and waiting to hear from the glib counselor for the defense of Sam Shephard, Dr. Carl Coppolino and the man called the "Boston Strangler."

After a weekend of motions and commotions over the "Strangler's" escape and recapture, the office was a mess. Full ash trays and empty whisky bottles sat on polished wood surfaces; even the brass replica of the scales of justice

was out of balance. Throwback to Bogart

Despite his red vest, Minox camera and tape recorders, Tuney isn't from the 007-U.N.C.L.E. school. At 43 and a grandfather thrice, he's a throwback to the Bogart tradition of private investigation. ("If you put it in the paper, that I'm a grandfather, broads all over the country will faint.")

Tuney was waiting for a telephone call from F. Lee. The hero lawyer was at that moment flying his own two-motored private plane to Boston-for a brief visit to the State Penitentiary where his recently replevened "Strangler" is being held.

DeGALVO was courts-martialed on 17 Aug 50 for Disobeying Lawful Orders, was found guilty and reduced in rank to Private and fined \$50."

According to Mr. Philip DiNatale of the Attorney General's Office for the State of Massachusetts, Boston, there was a note in the file that reflects Albert Henry DeSalvo was in the West Germany area but he did not have the exact locations.

DeSalvo returned to West Germany as a civilian, accompanied by his wife, Irmgard Beck, a German girl whom he married December 5, 1953. His stay in Germany was from June 15, 1959 to August 15, 1959.

stated that DeSalvo told him he was a "terror in Durope," meaning Germany and what he did there was the same that he did in Boston, Massachus evus, namely, rapes and murders.

Modus Operandi

Maintenance Man

Albert DeSalve posed as a maintenance man, on fassaults and murders on women 30 years of age and over. He would gain access to apartments by stating he was cont by the superintendent, or the owner, to check ceilings, floors and plumbing. (Note: All of the apartments he entered needed repairs in some way.)

Desalvo immediately lured his victims into the pathroom where 90% of the assaults and murders occurred. Desalvo, after luring his victim into the bathroom, would strengle them by placing his right arm around their neek, strengling them in the crock of his arm, which was expressly powerful.

Modelling Man

Albert DeSalvo would use this technique on women under 50 years of age and upon young girls.

He would gain access by stating he was from a model agency and that some fictitious person sent him to interview the girl. He would offer \$40 an hour, and in \$60,0 of the cases the girls would pose in the nude for him any of the assaults on young girls, Desalvo used a gun or knife, would tie them be and assault them.

Victims' Positions in the Murder Cases

It will be noted that of the 13 murdered victime, which murders allegedly were committed by DeSalvo, the main characteristics of the grotesque positions are as follows:

The victim was positioned so that, upon entering the room from any door, the body would be in full view.

The most notable characteristics of the body was that the body was positioned in such a way that all the sexual organs were noticed and the logs were spread wide apart.

Ligatures

Ligatures found on the victim's body always belonted to the victim herself.

Lightures used were silk stockings, leotards, scarves and pillow cases. On every victim there was tied two silk stockings in a medical knot or square knot.

Time of Assaults

All of the assaults and murders allegedly committed by DeSalvo were broken down during the hours of 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. Eighty percent of these crimes were committed during the week end.

Places of Crimes

All of the murders and assaults committed happened at multiple-dwelling apartments with brick fronts, of transient character, where many people were constantly coming and going. There were always two or three entrances and exits to these apartment houses. Investigation revealed that 90% of these apartment houses were sorely in need of repairs in one way or another.

DeSalvo always wore rubber surgical gloves and rubber overshoes.



DeSalvo was sentenced in Middlesex County Superior Court, Cambridge, Massachusetts, on January 18, 1967 to life imprisonment on assault charges, which did not include the 13 murders. Attorneys for DeSalvo have appealed his conviction and, as yet, a finding relative to the appeal has not been made.

It should be noted that the defense attorneys also, during the trial of DeSalvo relative to the assault charges, contended that DeSalvo was insene but the jury at Middlesem County, Cambridge, voted that he was sane and thus found him guilty on all counts.

Radio newscasts this morning told of the escape during the night from a Massachusetts State Hospital of Albert Di Salvo, the convicted self-admitted Boston strangler-rapist.

SAC Handley, Boston, was telephonically contacted to secure additional details. Handley advised that DiSalvo was confined to the Bridgewater, Massachusetts, Mental Hospital for the criminally insane and his method of escape is unknown at this time. Two other inmates also reportedly are missing from the institution. Handley advised that Agents are at Bridgewater maintaining liaison with institution officials and with the local district attorney so that, if applicable, unlawful flight process will be obtained at the earliest possible moment.

Di Salvo, who has been convicted and has received a life sentence for various sex crimes, was under confinement at the Bridgewater institution while his case, represented by the widely-publicized criminal attorney, F. Lee Bailey, is under appeal.

ACTION:

SAC Handley was instructed to closely follow this matter and to keep the Bureau promptly advised of pertinent developments.

On March 2, 1967, a review of the military records on file at the Military Personnel Records Center, St. Louis, disclose ALBERT HENRY DE SALVO, Serial Number 11 182 117, enlisted in the United States Army and entered on active duty on September 16, 1948, at FortBanks, Massachusetts. He served on active duty until June 25, 1951, at which time he was honorably discharged as a Private First Class, at Gelnhausen, Germany, to re-enlist in the United States Army.

He re-enlisted in the United States Army on June 26, 1951, at Gelnhausen, Germany, and continued on active duty until February 15, 1956, at which time he was honorably discharged, as a Sergeant, at Fort Dix, New Jersey, by reason of involuntary separation of enlisted personnel who are below current standards due to limitations of requirements of present needs.

The records disclosed DeSalvo had previously applied for enlistment in the United States Marine Corps on September 10, 1948, at Boston, Massachusetts, and had been rejected due to overweight.

DeSalvo had foreign service in Germany from December 28, 1948, to July 3, 1951, and from October 5, 1951, to March 27, 1954.

In addition to the stations in Germany above, it was noted that De Salvo received an award on February 11, 1949, at Colberg, Germany.

He was awarded the Good Conduct Medal, the Army of Occupation Medal with Germany Clasp, the National Defense Service Medal, the Marksman Badge with Pistol and Carbine Bars, and the Sharpshooter Badge with Rifle Bar.

His character and efficiency ratings ranged from "good" to "excellent" and there was no record of absence without official leave.

He was tried and convicted by a Summary Court-Martial on August 17, 1950, at Fritzlar, Germany, in that he, having received a lawful order from a non-commissioned officer, failed to obey same on or about August 5, 1950. He was sentenced to be reduced to the lowest enlisted grade and to forfeit \$50.00 of his pay.

The records revealed DeSalvo filed a claim with the Veterans Administration Regional Office, I Beacon Street, Boston, Massachusetts, on March 2, 1956, and all available medical records were forwarded to that facility on March 16, 1956. The claim was shown as "disability" and filed under Veterans Administration claim number C-19 634 060.

Richardson May Find DeSalvo Case Rough

By JACK O'SHEA

Atty. Gen. Elliot L. Richardson bit off a big chunk recently when he announced the reopening of the probe of self-acclaimed Boston Strangler Albert DeSalvo.

His office has a tremendous amount of work to do on the case because:

-Tapes of detailed conversations with the Malden handyman in 1965 may not be admissible at a trial, if any is ever

-Several key persons involved with the initial investigation are no longer in office.

In July, 1965, when DeSalvo first volunteered to tell officials of his alleged activities connected with the deaths of 13 Greater Boston women between 1962 and 1964, there was a stipulation that nothing he told them could be used in prosecu-

Former Asst. Atty. Gen. John S. Bottomly, head of the socalled Strangler Bureau established in 1964 by former Atty. Gen. Edward W. Brooke, recently disclosed that the tapes of conversations with DeSalvo have remained locked in a bank vault for which he has the only keys.

request that Bottomly turn over the tapes to his office.

Present during the several taped interviews with DeSalvo at Bridgewater State Hospital were several officials, These included, besides Bottomly, former State Police Lt. Det. Andrew J. Tuney, DeSalvo's guardian; former Corrections Commr. George McGrath. former Boston Police Det. Philip DiNatale, and DeSalvo's counsel, Atty. F. Lee Bailey.

Only Bailey still remains on the job.

Bottomly left office in the fall of 1966 to return to practice of private law. He is currently a co-ordinator for a Hollywood firm filming the Boston Strangler story.

DiNatale recently resigned from the Boston Police Dept. to become a consultant to the same movie film. Filming has been completed in Boston and the company is now in Califor-

Tuney left as chief investigator in the Strangler Bureau in October 1966 and is now head of Investigative Associates of Boston, a private detective firm.

bureau detectives, James Glynn, a former Boston Richardson has since made a police officer, and Steve De-

laney, a former MDC policeman, have left for private

Even the secretary to the former bureau has resigned. Miss Sandra Irizarry is now with Tuney's firm.

Before the special bureau was shut down, a vast collection of files including photographs of each crime scene had been compiled

Presumably this collection, representing two years' labor by a staff of at least four detectives, is in Richardson's possession.

Donald Conn, former assistant attorney general and now special assistant to Richardson, is presumably the man who would prosecute DeSalvo. Conn, while an assistant district attorney in Middlesex County, succeeded in January 1967 in getting DeSalvo convicted for four sex attacks,

DeSalvo has never been formally charged with any of the murders and the only comment from anyone in authority is that he has remained "a suspect.**

In the planned reopening, DeSalvo is expected to volumtarily incriminate himself before one or more grand juries and go on trial, hoping for a verdict of innocent by reason of insanity.

As a result of a raid by the State Police on the bookie establishment in Everett, Mass., on 1/4/68, newly-elected Mayor JOHN MC CARTHY has removed the three members of the Vice Squad and assigned them to other duties.



Justice ARTHUR WHITTEMORE found that there was the possibility that if the so-called "Rogers Rule" had been in use at the time, there would have been unanimous medical opinion that the defendant was not criminally responsible.

The so-called "Rogers Rule" is based on the American Law Institute's Model Penal Code. The code states, "A person is not responsible for criminal conduct if at the time of such conduct, as a result of mental disease or defect, he lacks substantial capacity to appreciate the criminality of his conduct as to conform his conduct to the requirements of law."

The State Supreme Judicial Court, in another action, also refused to overturn the conviction of the self-confessed Boston Stranglar, ALBERT DE SALVO, on assault charges in Middlesex County Superior Court.

Bailey: Strangler Is a Wild Vegetable

Staff Correspondent of THE NEWS Cambridge, Mass., Jan. 12-His eyes closed, his head down, his right hand shielding part of his face, Albert H. DeSalvo heard himself described today as the "completely uncontrolled vegetable" who in 18 months "committed 13 acts of homicide" and as a man whose abnormal sexual drive is "extremely extreme."

Not once did the 35-year-old ex-Army sergeant who says he is the Boston Strangler, lift his head as the seamy details of his Strangler, rape-murders which childhood and his self-confessed rape-murder were repeated to his male jurors.

He wept quietly and briefly once, as a defense psychiatrist told the court, mainly in Desalvo's own words, how he once did not strangle an intended vic-tim because "he saw her face in the mirror . . . He immedi-ately stopped, tears came to his eyes."

Tears Won't Stop

And he continued to cry as the psychiatrist, Dr. James A. Brussel, New York state asristant commissioner of the De-partment of Mental Health, continued the horrifying story. Not once were the words "Bos-ton strangler" uttered in the

huge, jammed courtroom, where DeSalvo is on trial for armed robbery, breaking and entering, indecent assault and battery, and unnatural acts.

But his defense attorney, F.
